- Providing appropriate safety devices and personal protective equipment (PPE).
- Maintaining, in good order, equipment, premises and infrastructure.
- Making available a HSW Manual which outlines the organisation of responsibilities and duties and the arrangements for promotion, compliance and implementation of this Policy within the Trust.
- Setting out clear procedures for the management of HSW issues.
- Implementing any necessary amendments upon significant legislative, management, operational or organisational change.
- Reviewing this Policy and the HSW Manual annually.
