## Main responsibilities

### **Key duties**

- Increase John Muir Trust presence in Wales (with England & Wales Manager and other Regional/Partnership Managers) to meet key targets, in particular 30% of Awards achieved by underrepresented groups.
- Support the network of John Muir Award Providers and supporters to access, plan and deliver high quality Award activity and learn more about the John Muir Trust. This requires a high level of customer service and delivery of training/CPD opportunities.
- Relate activity to relevant Government initiatives such as wellbeing, health, employability, youth work, 1 million Welsh Speakers, social action and biodiversity/nature connection
- Develop effective internal and external communications including sharing stories, updating funders, producing case studies and developing resources.
- Develop and deliver effective partnerships and projects, with support from the England and Wales Manager, to increase the support (financial and practical) for the Award across Wales.
- Responsibility for the development and delivery of Urdd Gobaith Cymru Partnership.
- Development of the Trusts communications through Welsh Language.

• Work across the Award and Trust teams to share good practice, develop wider planning for engaging communities across Wales and the UK.
