Introduction

We are looking for someone to lead on the management of the Trust's toilet facilities at Blairmore car park while engaging widely with visitors, local residents and other organisations in the wider area.

This is an important opportunity for an enthusiastic and hardworking individual to work closely with the Sandwood Conservation Officer, local crofters, residents, and visitors; providing communication and advice to visitors; promoting the Trust's work and ethos, while taking responsibility for the maintenance and management of facilities at Blairmore car park at Oldshorebeg.

If successful, you will report role into the Land Development Manager - Sandwood & Quinag.

Main responsibilities

Key duties

- Manage and maintain the WC; including regularly cleaning the WC block, maintaining the upkeep of facilities and materials. Reporting defects to Land Development Manager.
- Monitoring, managing car park use and overseeing refuse collection service. Keeping the car park and surrounding area free of litter.
- Ensuring leaflet dispensers are topped up and in good condition.
- Maintaining inventory of cleaning products and replenish as required through Land Development Manager.
- Communicate and engage with visitors to promote and encourage responsible access, camping and parking in accordance with the Scottish Outdoor Access Code (SOAC).
- Guidance and particularly the 'leave no trace' ethos.
- Follow Trust H&S procedures and policies at all times including Covid 19 guidance.
- Promoting the work of the Trust, encouraging donations, membership, and engagement.

• Provide seasonal help to Conservation Officers to deliver events such as local beach cleans guided walks and working with the local schools to deliver the John Muir Award.
